T5 Switch, model TS-524 and TW-5XX Wallplates

Firmware 5.4.3.0-018R

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Hardware

T5 WiFi over VDSL Switch, model TS-0524-WR

The T5 Switch (TS-0524-WR) is a 24-port concentrator installed in a central wiring closet. It connects to single pair telephone grade UTP wire and delivers high speed data along with line power to Wallplate devices installed in a remote room.

TW 522 Wireless Wallplate, Dual Radio 802.11ac, model TW-0522-67030

TW-0522-67030-US = for shipment into the United States and territories TW-0522-67030-1-WR = for shipment into EU and other Non-US countries. Not all global countries are supported by the TW-522 TW-0522-67030-EU = No longer available. Use "-1-WR" version for EU countries

The TW-522 Wireless Wallplate has 2 x 10/100Mb Ethernet ports, and integrated 802.11a/b/g/n/AC radios with enterprise class features. It is managed by the T5 PowerBroadband Switch. The TW-522 supports both 2.4GHz network and 5GHz network concurrently using two integrated radios.

TW 511 Wireless Wallplate, model TW-0511-60010

TW-0511-60010-US = for shipment into the United States and territories
TW-0511-60010-EU = for shipment into countries of the European Union
TW-0511-60010-WR = for shipment into other countries not covered by the EU or US regulatory domains. Not all global countries are supported by the TW-511

The Wireless Wallplate has $2 \times 10/100 \text{Mb}$ Ethernet ports, and an integrated 802.11a/b/g/n radio with enterprise class features. It is managed by the T5 PowerBroadband Switch.



TW 510 Ethernet Wall switch, model TW-0510-WR

The Wired Wallplate (TW-0510-WR) has $2 \times 10/100$ Mb Ethernet ports. Each Ethernet port can be managed from the T5 Switch; setting speed, duplex, up/down, along with per port VLANs and QoS.

Compatibility with older T-Series

The TS-524 is not compatible with previously released T-series products. This includes previously released T-Series switches (model 45025, 45125, 45225 and 45325) and M-series Wallplates (model 45001, 45101, 45002, 45004, 45010).

The inline filters and local power supplies are fully compatible with TS-524 (models 65602, 65603, 65604, 65004).

Key Features in the T5 PowerBroadband System

VDSL2

The T5 PowerBroadband system uses VDSL2 to provide line rates up to 100Mbps downstream and 50Mbps upstream. VDSL2 uses DMT signal coding to provide superior EMI avoidance.

Country-Code Selection

The country code must be configured on the T5 Switch. The Wallplate SKU must match the configured country code on the T5 Switch. If the SKU does not match the configured code, the radio will not be enabled.

To view the country SKU of the connected Wallplate, use command:

TS-0524# show cpe system

To identify Wallplates that have disabled radios due to a country code mismatch, use command: TS-0524# show cpe status

A Wallplate that has been disabled by the TS-524 will have the alarm "regulatory". Only the radio will be disabled, the Ethernet ports will continue to operate.

Adaptive Line Power

The T5 PowerBroadband system retains the same line power system as the T3 Switch, model 45325. This provides operating power for the remotely installed Wallplate AP over the same single pair of telephone wire used for VDSL backhaul and analog telephone service. The following chart shows the estimated wire length for each type of connected Wallplate.

The TS-524 Switch uses the interface index scheme from the T3 Switch. The interface descriptions contain changes listed in the following chart.

All interfaces will appear in this table. Note that not all information is available for each entry. The port description field will show the default port name if not otherwise configured from the CLI or webUI.

Interfaces are indexed using 6 positions

000dd0: For CO DSL port (dd=01-24)

Installation Tips and Guidelines

- 1. Only enable line power on DSL ports that are terminated to the in-building wiring and have a TW-510, TW-511 or TW-522 Wallplate connected on the other end
 - a. This is a firm guideline that must be followed
- 2. With long wire lengths, it may take longer than expected for the DSL lines to achieve a stable link. It may be useful to establish the maximum stable line rate, and then apply that line rate across all other DSL lines. Follow this suggested procedure:
 - a. Enable two or three DSL lines
 - b. After they link, note the SNR Margin. It should be above 6dB. Note the Downstream and Upstream data rates
 - c. For other DSL lines, enter the same value for Downstream and Upstream Target data rate
 - d. All DSL lines should quickly achieve a stable link
 - e. Go back and verify the first few DSL lines maintain a SNR Margin of 6dB or higher
- 3. Deploy the same firmware version on Wallplates and the TS-524 Switch. Having mismatched firmware can lead to unpredictable behavior. Wallplate firmware can be stored on the file system of the TS-524 Switch or on an external FTP/TFTP server.

New Features in 5.4.3.0-018R

RADIUS Dynamic Authorization

Add support for RFC3576 RADIUS dynamic authorization for wpa-enterprise

NAS-Identifier and Service-Type in WPA-Enterprise

Add WLAN NAS-Identifier and support for Service-Type attribute for WPA-Enterprise NAS-Identifier command located in WLAN config: radius nas-identifier <string>

Access Control List for Wireless

GUI: Access Control List configuration is located under Security -> Access Control Assignment of Access Control List is configured in WLAN configuration.

Example of CLI Commands to allow ARPs from hosts of a specific vendor: mac access-list TestACL permit 00:E0:81:00:00:00/FF:FF:FF:00:00:00 any priority 100 type arp deny any any priority 9999 type arp exit wlan TestWLAN access-list TestACL direction out exit



Auto-channel Restriction to 1, 6 and 11 on 2.4GHz

Auto-channel can now be configured to restrict channels to only 1, 6 and 11 on 2.4GHz

Command: interface radioX-Y.1 channel auto-1.6.11 Example: interface radio1-24.1 channel auto-1.6.11

Support for 802.11ac 80MHz channels

Command: interface radioX.2 channel Y bandwidth 80 (where X=DSL port and Y=Channel)

Example: interface radio1.2 channel 36 bandwidth 80

Minimum Data Rate Configuration for 2.4GHz

A minimum data-rate can now be configured for 2.4GHz in the WLAN Command located in WLAN config: min-rate <auto/6/12/24>
Example Commands: wlan EXTREME-WIRELESS
min-rate 6

In GUI, under Wireless Client Status, hit the "#" sign and select "Uptime" to add to the view In the CLI, use command: show wireless client custom uptime



Bugs Fixed in 5.4.3.0-018R

Passpoint: Increase domain name, nai realm, operator and osu names to 256 characters

SNMP MIB: Changed MIB to fix a compile error seen in OpenNMS

Various fixes to 802.1X Wired Authentication

Double CPE config timeout to allow larger configurations to complete

Fixed several problems that occurred when an SSID was changed on an enabled WLAN.

- Clients would continue to show up on old SSID
- Clients could no longer authenticate to other (unchanged) WLAN on the same T5 switch

Known Issues in 5.4.3.0-018R

TW5XX CPEs running old pre-5.1.0.0 firmware may have problems linking to a T5 switch running 5.4.3.0 firmware. If you are upgrading from old firmware, be sure to upgrade the CPEs and boot them to the new image at the same time or before the T5 switch.

When a T5 switch is configured via WiNG, CPE LED configuration only works correctly if configured in either the Profile, or in the Device. If changes are made to both, the configuration changes stop taking effect.

Work-around: Only configure the CPE LED in one place. Choose to use either the Profile, or the Device.

It is recommended that you upgrade to the latest firmware version as soon as it becomes available.

Upgrade Instructions

You can upgrade from the GUI or from the CLI. In either case, a TFTP or FTP server is required.

In the GUI, Upgrade is under the Administer menu. To copy the TWXX image to the T5 switch, use Copy under the Files menu. The Source Path is the FTP/TFTP path and filename (TW5XX-5.4.3.0-018R.img), Destination is simply the filename.




Example of GUI



When the file has finished copying, the "Sending" message will go away and the file will show up under "Files" in Root (located in that same Files menu).


Upgrade TW5XXs in the Administer / Upgrade / CPE menu.

Example of GUI



When status for CPEs is Success, Set "Next Boot" to Secondary and hit Submit (won't reboot anything)

Upgrade the T5 switch in the Administer / Upgrade / CO menu.



When Upgrade Status says "Success", set "Next Boot" to Secondary and hit Submit.

Use the Administer / Reboot menu to reboot the T5 switch. If you are using Line Power for the TW5XX wallplates, this will also reboot them. If using local power, reboot them first, then reboot the T5 switch.



For CLI, you must be in Configuration Mode. To enter Configuration Mode, use command: config

Step 1a – Make a back-up of your current configuration. CLI Command: copy running-config myconfig

Step 1b - Copy the back-up config to your TFTP or FTP server

CLI Command: copy myconfig tftp://<IP address>/<path/filename>

Step 2 - Download the firmware and copy the image files to your local TFTP or FTP server.

Step 3 – Copy the TW5XX-5.4.3.0-018R.img file to the local file system of your T5 switch using either TFTP or FTP. This is the CPE image file that will be used to upgrade the remote TW5XX wallplates.

CLI Commands:

copy tftp://<IP address>/<path/filename> <filename> copy ftp://<user>:<password>@<IP address>/<path/filename> <filename>

Example: copy tftp://192.168.1.10/downloads/TW5XX-5.4.3.0-018R.img TW5XX-5.4.3.0-018R.img

Step 4 – Verify file is now on T5 local file system. Command: dir

Step 5 – Upgrade TW5XX CPEs, but do not boot to secondary image yet.

Command: cpe upgrade cpe<range> <filename>

Example: cpe upgrade cpe1-24 TW5XX-5.4.3.0-018R.img

Step 6 – Check status of CPE upgrade. Do not go to next step until they have completed (100%)

Command: show cpe boot

Step 7 – Upgrade the T5 switch using either TFTP or FTP

Commands:

upgrade tftp://<IP address>/<path/filename>

upgrade ftp://<user>:<password>@<IP address>/<path/file>

Example: upgrade tftp://192.168.1.10/downloads/TS524-5.4.3.0-018R.img

Step 8 - Check status of T5 upgrade. Do not go to next step until the upgrade has completed (100%)

Command: show boot

Step 9 – Set T5 switch and TW5XX CPEs to boot to their secondary image



Commands:

boot system secondary cpe boot system cpe<range> secondary

Example of CPE command: cpe boot system cpe1-24 secondary

Step 10 – Reboot the T5 switch and TW5XX CPEs.

If using local power supplies for the CPEs, you need to reboot them before rebooting the T5 switch. If you are only using T5 to line power the CPEs, you only need to reboot the T5 switch and that will automatically reboot the CPEs.

Command to reboot the CPEs: cpe reload cpe<range>

Command to reboot the T5 switch: reload

Step 11 – Verify T5 switch and TW5XX CPEs are running 5.4.3.0-018R.img

Commands: show boot show cpe boot

If you are having trouble upgrading the TW5XX wallplates, try booting the T5 switch to the newest firmware first, then attempt the TW5XX upgrade again.

Important Note on Downgrading from 5.4 to Previous Release

If you need to downgrade from 5.4.3.0-018R to an earlier release that doesn't support the Cluster Controller feature (pre-5.4.2.1 firmware), you must first remove profiles and devices from your startup.cfg. This only applies if you have configured the T5 as a Cluster Controller. If you made a backup of your configuration file prior to upgrading, you can simply copy that back to the startup.cfg and reboot.

Command: copy myconfig /config/startup.cfg



TW-511 and TW-522 Survey Instructions

The TW511 and TW522 Wallplates will automatically be in Wireless Survey mode when powered up while disconnected from the T5 switch. Contact pbn.support@extremenetworks.com for updated TW-522 survey code.

Survey Configuration Instructions:

Connect a PC to FE1 on the TW-5XX. Configure your PC to have a static IP address in the accepted range, and log in using this information:

Default IP address: 192.168.1.250/24

Username: survey

Password: admin123 (all lower case)

The following configurations are supported in Site Survey mode:

Configure IP Address: IP address of the unit. <IP address>/<subnet mask bits> Configure Wireless: SSID, Transmit Power, Channel (1-11, 36, 40, 44, 48)

Configure iPerf: TCP or UDP. Always runs in Server mode

Main Menu:

- 1. Configure IP Address
- 2. Configure Wireless
- 3. Configure iPerf
- 4. Save Configuration
- 5. Reboot (to activate new config)
- 6. Upgrade Software
- 0. Exit

Important Note Once the survey is configured and saved, the only way to reset the survey to Default is by connecting it to a T5 switch. If the IP address is changed from the default configuration, that is the units new IP address. You will need to use that new IP address to access the survey menu. Currently, there is no way to default the unit without a T5 switch.

The Survey menu does not allow backspace. If you type incorrectly, simply <enter> through until you are back at the menu and start over on that command.

You must reboot to activate the new survey configuration and begin broadcasting.



Survey Upgrade Instructions:

5.0.11.0-005R added the ability to upgrade the TW5XX wallplate without the use of a T5 switch. If field units are on 5.0.11.0-005R or later, they can be upgraded to latest code without being connected to a T5 switch.

Example of Upgrade

Assume image file is in c:\downloads\T5 directory and the TFTP root download directory is "C:\downloads". Note - you must reboot to activate the new application image.

Notes from Previous 5.x Releases

New Features in 5.4.2.2-003R

T5-5.4.2.2 enables support to configure EU country codes on WR SKU. Downgrading the same device to pre T5-5.4.2.2 release software doesn't support EU country codes.

Bugs Fixed in 5.4.2.2-003R

Block unused TCP ports for security

Fix problem where CPEs with different configurations would incorrectly load the configuration of another CPE on the same T5 switch

Fix problem where some DLS ports will not stay linked on a T5 that doesn't have all ports enabled. Message seen in syslog is "CPE time-out during detecting phase"

Known Issues in 5.4.2.2-003R

TW5XX CPEs running old pre-5.1.0.0 firmware may have problems linking to a T5 switch running 5.4.2.2 firmware. If you are upgrading from old firmware, be sure to upgrade the CPEs and boot them to the new image at the same time or before the T5 switch.

Bugs Fixed in 5.4.2.1-011R

Patches for KRACK attack

Bugs Fixed in 5.4.2.1-010R

Fixed auto-channel bug that was introduced in version 5.4.2.1-007R release. If TW-511 is configured for 5GHz and auto-channel, the radio status indicated "up", but radio would not broadcast. Occasionally, the bug can impact the TW-522 5GHz radio as well.

Fixed bug where SSID will be reset to the default (same as the WLAN name) when configuration changes are made to the WLAN.

GUI: Improvements to client wireless history graph and other minor changes.

Bugs Fixed in 5.4.2.1-007R

New Features in 5.4.2.0-010R

Wi-Fi Certified for 802.11n connectivity

Dynamic VLAN Support for Wireless Clients

The T5 now supports Dynamic VLANs for wireless clients in conjunction with RADIUS authentication for WPA Enterprise Security. When the T5 is configured for RADIUS and Dynamic VLANs are enabled, the T5 will assign a VLAN to the end-user based on the RADIUS configuration for that user. The T5 passes the authentication request to the configured 3rd party RADIUS server.

Configuration Instructions:

*** Note: These instructions assume that you already have a working T5 RADIUS configuration and that the wireless client has a VLAN association configured on the upstream RADIUS server.

RADIUS must be enabled and configured on the T5 and WPA-Enterprise must be configured on the WLAN. All VLANs that may be associated to a wireless client MUST be manually added to the necessary DSL and GE interfaces.

To enable Dynamic VLAN support:

Enter configuration mode using command: config

Change to the WPA-Enterprise configured WLAN context using command: wlan <WLAN name>

Enable dynamic VLAN support using command: radius vlan-assignment

Exit back to root context using command: exit

Create the end-user VLANs and add them to the necessary T5 interfaces using commands:

interface vlan<VLAN ID>

exit

interface ge<1 or 2> switchport trunk allowed vlan add <VLAN ID>



interface dsl1-24 switchport trunk allowed vlan add <VLAN ID> # Repeat above command for all necessary end-user VLANs

Save the configuration using command: write mem

Bugs Fixed in 5.4.2.0-010R

Bug 961

Cannot configure Bridge Aging time in the profile when using Google Chrome browser

Bug 960 and 989

Configuration errors and crashes when T5 is attempting to adopt to a WiNG controller

Bug 1025

Make radioX.2 default to 11ac

Bug 1030

Remove SGI 40MHz advertisement beacon on 20MHz channel

Bug 1033

Do not permit a-only on 40MHz channel

Bug 1044

SNMP queries will hang until T5 switch is rebooted

Management Hang – The T5 switch attempts to detect the management hang and recover by rebooting. A message is added to the log file identifying the reason for the reboot.

Miscellaneous Cluster Controller and WiNG adoption fixes

Miscellaneous GUI improvements and fixes

Fix problem where IPTV stream stops intermittently due to TW5XX wallplate acting as IGMP querier

Known Limitations in 5.4.2.0-010R

TW5XX CPEs that have very old firmware may have problems linking to a T5 switch that has been upgraded to 5.4.2.0-010R. CPEs with firmware versions 5.0.1.0-013R and 5.0.2.0-001R should be upgraded and booted to the new firmware prior to booting the T5 switch to 5.4.2.0-010R.

Bug 999

Can no longer view files in T5 file system if a file with a space in the name is uploaded Work-around: none – contact pbn.support@extremenetworks.com



Bug 889

"write memory" command takes a long time to complete.

Work-around: none currently. The command does work, but may take longer than usual to complete.

Bug 1020

Some TW522 statistics show 0 on the 5GHz radio. Most important statistics are correct.

Workaround: none at this time

Bug 998

CPE Ethernet Loop-Detection does not block a pre-existing loop if it was disabled at the time the loop occurred.

Work-around: Disable and re-enable FE port, or make sure Loop-Detection is enabled before loops occur.

Bug 943

Wireless Client shows on 2 radios simultaneously - need to prune them

Workaround: use command sho mac-address-table

Bug 1021

Add/modify of radius server parameters requires reboot of CPE with WPA-enterprise 2 wlan Workaround: reboot the CPEs after RADIUS parameter changes are made

Bug 1019

Two radius servers with same priority should not be allowed by T5

Workaround: correctly specify different priorities for each configured RADIUS server

Cluster Controller Bugs

Bug 997

Member loses network communication to controller if configured on VLAN other than 1 Work-around: Configure *ip default gateway* to IP address in same subnet as the controller / member VLAN, or use VLAN 1 for controller / member communication.

Bug 618

Downgrade from 5.4.2.0-010R causes problems and instability

Workaround: Contact pbn.support@zebra.com prior to downgrade – modification of the startup.cfg file may be necessary.

Bug 964

When you create a profile in the GUI, it should automatically show up under Manage Profiles Work-around: Click on Manage Profiles a couple of times, or refresh browser

802.1x Authentication on FE ports is currently a **beta** feature only. Please contact pbn.support@zebra.com to get a list of known issues.



New Features in 5.4.1.0-006R

Cluster Controller

When cluster mode is enabled, one TS-524 Switch can be used to monitor-only the network; or adopt and manage up to 11 other TS-524 Switches and their connected Wallplate devices. A total of 288 Wallplates can thus be centrally managed (12 Switches * 24 Wallplates). Management features include provisioning DSL lines, Wallplates and Radios; upgrading firmware; and gathering operational statistics for all connected DSL lines and Wallplates.

802.1x Wired Port Authenticator

This feature is included in the T5-5.4.1.0-006R release as a demo feature. It may have operational issues, please see the bug list to see if this feature will work for your topology. When 802.1x authentication is enabled, the Fast Ethernet port on the Wallplate will assign a unique VLAN ID upon successful authentication to a AAA server. If authentication fails, the port native VLAN ID is assigned to device packets ingressing on the Fast Ethernet port. This applies to the TW-510, TW-511, and TW-522.

Dual Band Concurrent Radio

The TW-522 includes two radios for dual band concurrent access at 2.4GHz and 5GHz. The 2.4GHz radio supports 802.11b/g/n; while the 5GHz radio supports 802.11a/n/ac. 802.11ac support includes 256QAM MCS rates and channel bonding up to 40MHz. Maximum RF datarate on the 5GHz radio is 433Mbps.

Fast Ethernet Port Loop Detection

Wallplates with Fast Ethernet ports now include Loop Detection and shutdown. When enabled, Fast Ethernet ports will detect a port loop and block the interface. The port will be unblocked when loop back condition is cleared and detection will resume. This feature applies to the TW-510, TW-511, and TW-522.

Miscellaneous Enhancements

GUI: Implemented pull-down menus for cleaner look and feel

Upgrades: The CPE image is now cached on the T5 switch, so it is no longer necessary to copy the CPE image file to the T5 file system – CPE upgrades can be done directly from the TFTP/FTP server.

SNMP: Added SNMP Traps for radio up/down

Support for TW-522 Dual Radio Wallplate

CLI configuration for TW-522

Radio CLI configuration for the TW-522 is accomplished using the following 2 commands: int radioX.Y rf-mode <2.4GHz-wlan|5GHz-wlan> int radioX.Y data-rates <b-only|g-only|a-only|bg|bgn|gn|an|ac> X = DSL port

Y = Radio 1 or 2 on the TW522

Note: Only the 2nd radio supports ac (radioX.2).

LED Behavior for TW-522 - Radio LED

Blink green/amber when both radios are enabled. Solid green and blink on traffic when only 2.4GHz radio is enabled (same as TW-511) Solid amber and blink on traffic when only 5GHz radio is enabled (same as TW-511)

CPE Ethernet Loop Detection

The T5 can now be configured to detect and stop loops on the TW-5XX FE ports.

New CLI Commands for CPE Ethernet Loop Detection

int feX.Y loop-detection enable

Cluster Controller Configuration

The T5 switch can now act as a Cluster Controller for up to 12 T5 switch members. It can be set to simply monitor the adopted members, or it can be set to configure the members.

The adoption mode specifies whether the controller automatically adopts new members or whether they must be added manually.

Profiles can be created on the controller and assigned to the adopted members to simplify configuration.



Tags are used to easily group T5 members together for monitoring and basic administrative tasks, such as upgrades, reboots and profile assignments. There are two pre-defined tags: *adopted-t5* and *all-t5*.

Devices are either T5 switches or Tags that signify a group of T5 switches.

Most administrators will create a basic profile and make all T5 switches a member. Things like hostname and DSL description will be configured on the individual members. If the cluster controller access is set to "view-only", the individual configurations must be done locally on the T5 switch. If the access is set to "configurable", they must be done from the controller.

It is recommended that customers contact pbn.support@zebra.com prior to implementing the Cluster Controller in a live environment. Support will provide an App Note with recommended processes.

User Selectable DSL Band Plans

Version 5.3 firmware introduces the ability to select a DSL band plan that best suits the needs of the individual property. The band plans that are currently available are:

Default – This is the DSL band plan that ships with all T5 systems. It provides up to 100 Mbps downstream and up to 50 Mbps upstream. It optimizes the downstream while attempting to provide approximately 30% of the bandwidth for the upstream. It is a good band plan to use at properties that are focused on providing internet access to their guests. It is designed for properties that do not exceed 1500 feet of wire distance.

DS Plus – This DSL band plan focuses the bandwidth on the downstream by sacrificing some of the upstream bandwidth. It provides up to 100 Mbps downstream and up to 14 Mbps upstream. The benefit of this band plan is longer distance links will achieve higher speeds compared to the default. It is designed for properties that need more downstream bandwidth and is especially useful when implementing video.



LongReach – This DSL band plan is designed for properties that often exceed 1500 feet and will likely be using local power supplies. The LongReach band plan allows for links up to 4500 feet.

The band plan can be selected in the GUI on the Wired/DSL/Common Settings section. Once you select a new band plan and hit <submit>, it will cause all DSL lines to drop and re-link.

Or it can be selected in the CLI using command: dsl bandplan <Default | DS.Plus | LongReach>

Improved GUI and new Diagnostic tools

GUI Improvements – The GUI has many improvements including important additions to the Summary and DSL Monitor pages.

The summary page provides a quick, but effective look at the overall health of the network. Additions to this page include DSL and System statistics.

The DSL Monitor page now has a History tab that allows you to see critical DSL information over a selected period of time, either 1, 7 or 30 days. Information includes link losses, errors and power draw.

These diagnostic tools are only available in the GUI and are located in the Tools section.

Client Query Tools

Allows the user to select and view critical wireless statistics in real time, such as average RSSI, throughput and transmit retry percentage. Simply click on the fields that you wish to display simultaneously and hit submit. The results can be exported to an Excel spreadsheet via the Export button in the upper right corner of the results section – button is shown as an "E".

DSL History Query Tool

Allows the user to filter DSL operational parameters, errors, and performance. Single data sets may be queried, or multiple data sets combined to filter the results based on varying parameters and thresholds. The results are displayed for current data, or a time filter can be applied to expand the data up to the prior 30 days. It is extremely useful for troubleshooting and for checking the health of the DSL network. Simply click on the fields that you wish to display simultaneously and hit submit. The results can be exported to an Excel spreadsheet via the Export button in the upper right corner of the results section – button is shown as an "E". The values are collected at 15 minute intervals, so the query range must be at least 15 minutes yield results.

Note: Only ten criteria can be used simultaneously for DSL queries. Two criteria are reserved for time limits and up to eight additional criteria can be selected for a query.

Broadcast Storm control added

T5 will limit rate of incoming broadcast and unknown unicast packets to ensure bandwidth for user data in case of broadcast storms.

Demo Features in 5.3.0.0-010R

These features have been added, but are not fully tested. They are considered demo features only. The Audit History is available under Tools.

Audit History

Audit history allows the user to monitor network latency to a given host. This feature is effective in testing response time for network elements that are not managed by a Zebra management platform. Examples include the Internet router, or a host on the Internet. By comparing values for multiple hosts at different points in the network, the administrator can determine the location where network latency is occurring. Up to three hosts may be entered. Two network tests are supported:

Network Latency – This test performs a ping test to the configured host IP address. Simply add the IP address of the host and hit submit.

DNS Latency – This test performs a check of the DNS latency in resolving the configured host. To configure this test, add the IP address of the DNS server and the DNS name of the host. Example of DNS hostname: zebra.com

Additionally, you can configure the Latency Threshold. When this value is configured, an alarm will be generated when the latency exceeds the configured value.

If the user forgets their IP address, they simply connect to FE2 with an IP address on the 192.168.10.X network, TELNET to 192.168.10.250 and change the IP address for FE1, save and reboot. FE2 should only be used as the backdoor to reconfigure the IP address assigned to FE1.

Alarms

In version 5.2, T5 now tracks critical alarm conditions, including Over-Current, Line Errors, Line Availability, Regulatory, System Temperature and System Power.

Alarms can be viewed via CLI, SNMP and GUI.

See the "New Commands in 5.2.0.0-015R" section for CLI alarm commands.

In the GUI, the alarms can be viewed in Monitor-> Alarms

With the latest Enterprise MIB, the T5 will send traps. See SNMP Alarm Traps section below.

RadioShare WIPs requires a valid license on the AirDefense appliance. Support for T5 on the AirDefense appliance is scheduled for Q1-2014 in ADSP version 9.1.1. RadioShare WIPs operates on the same radio used for data access and does not require a dedicated radio.

Location Based Services

In T5-5.1.0, this is an evaluation feature, pending release of ADSP version 9.1.1. 5.1.0 includes support for 802.11 wireless locationing when used with the AirDefense appliance. Location services requires a proximity license on the ADSP appliance. Support for T5 is scheduled for Q1-2014 in ADSP version 9.1.1.

Increased Wireless Transmit Power

5.1.0 includes a new regulatory power table for all US, EU, and WR SKUs. The new power table is more granular and provides an overall increase in transmit power.

NAT feature added for TW51X CPEs

The T5 switch will perform Network Address Translation services for CPEs configured on a private VLAN. This enables services such as ADSP WIPs and CPE upgrades from an external TFTP/FTP server without configuration on the public network.
