Release TPVM 4.6.10 provides the following features:

Changes in Behavior

The following are the behavioral changes for TPVM 4.6.10.

• No behavioral changes were introduced in this release.

Hardware and Software Support

- TPVM 4.6.10 supports the following hardware platforms: SLX 9150, SLX 9250, SLX 9540, SLX 9640, SLX 9740, Extreme 8520, Extreme 8720, and Extreme 8820.
- Minimum supported SLX-OS version for TPVM 4.6.10 is SLX-OS 20.5.1a.
- Full install is required for upgrade and downgrade between TPVM versions lower than 4.6.0 and TPVM version 4.6.10.
- Incremental upgrade is supported to 4.6.10 from 4.6.0.

Note: Releases prior to TPVM version 4.5.5 are not supported as per baseline-free upgrade.

Limitations and Restrictions

- User is required to change the TPVM password after upgrading to SLX-OS 20.5.1a. This is due to Ubuntu 20.04 LTS having a restriction with supporting certain special ASCII characters. The procedure to change the password is explained in the section <u>Procedure to change TPVM</u> <u>password</u>.
- Incremental upgrade is not supported between TPVM versions lower than 4.6.0 and TPVM version 4.6.10.
 - Example: Incremental upgrade and downgrade between TPVM 4.5.12 and 4.6.10 versions is not supported. If a user attempts it, the following error message is displayed.

Error: As Ubuntu LTS version is upgraded between the TPVM versions, incremental upgrade is not supported.

 When IPv6 address only is configured, TPVM incremental upgrade (downgrade) to tpvm version lower than 4.6.8 is not supported from tpvm version higher than 4.6.7. This limitation is not applicable to cases when IPv4 address only is configured or both IPv4 and IPv6 addresses are configured.

Upgrading TPVM to 4.6.10

- Full install is supported from version lower than 4.6.0.
- Incremental upgrade is supported from version 4.6.0.
- Minimum version requirements:
 - SLX-OS 20.5.1a
- Upgrade procedure
 - \circ $\:$ Step 1: Upgrade SLX-OS current version to SLX-OS 20.5.1a or above.
 - Step 2: Change the TPVM password. (Section: Procedure to change TPVM Password)
 - Step 3: Full upgrade TPVM to 4.6.9.

Procedure to change TPVM Password

• Step 1: From SLX-OS, stop the running TPVM by executing the exec command "tpvm stop".

```
SLX# tpvm stop
stop succeeds
SLX#
```

- Step 2: From SLX-OS, remove the TPVM password. Default password will be set to the TPVM. SLX(config-tpvm-TPVM) # no password SLX(config-tpvm-TPVM) #
- Step 3: From SLX-OS, change the password for TPVM. SLX(config-tpvm-TPVM) # password **** SLX(config-tpvm-TPVM) #
- Step 4: From SLX-OS, start the TPVM by executing the exec command "tpvm start".

```
SLX# tpvm start
start succeeds
SLX#
```

tpvm_sec_upgrade.sh script

The 'tpvm_upgrade.sh' script is deprecated. Since Ubuntu's LTS version has been upgraded, it is necessary to perform a full upgrade.

This script cannot be used to upgrade to TPVM 4.6.10.
